The Bennett Place where on April 17, 1865 Confederate General Joseph E. Johnston and Union General William T. Sherman met to discuss the terms of surrender. On April 26, of the same year, the surrender documents were signed making this the largest troop surrender of the War of Northern Aggression.

Duke Homestead State Historic Site



Duke Homestead offers an orientation film twice an hour, an extensive [tobacco museum](#), and guided tours of the surviving historical structures on the grounds. Among these structures are early [Bright Leaf tobacco barns](#), Washington Duke's first and third factories, and his 1852 homestead.
